5.15 Motorcycle Guidelines

ALL USE OF THE MOTOR CYCLE WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE RESIDENTIAL MANAGER

All students must comply with the following guidelines whilst riding motorcycles on the College site.

1. Motorcycle Operations

- Participants shall provide written consent of their parents, or guardian, before participation is permitted.
- Participants must demonstrate an understanding and competence in the use of the equipment along with a willingness to adhere to all instructions that may be given.
- All students must ride motorcycles in a safe and responsible manner at all time.
- Students are not to engage in riding on the College motorcycle track unless express permission is given by the supervising staff member.
- A minimum of two students are to be present at the motorcycle area along with 1 staff member.
- Motorcycles must be ridden in a slow and safe manner from the motorcycle shed to the motorcycle track.
- All riders must walk their machines across all roads.
- If required motorcycles may be washed down adjacent to the farm workshop. This area is to be kept clean
- Students are responsible for the cleanliness of motorcycle shed and surrounds as well as the track area.
- No motorcycle over 250CC is to be ridden on the College site, unless express permission from the Motorcycle Co-ordinator is received.
- All participants are required to wear suitable safety equipment, including a correctly sized and fitted helmet, safety goggles (or visor) and gloves that comply with the appropriate Australian Standards.
- All participants shall wear suitable clothing when riding a motorcycle

The minimum required standards of clothing are:

- Enclosed footwear
- Long trousers
- Long sleeve shirt

2. Equipment Safety and Management

- The Motorcycle Club Co-ordinator will inspect all equipment and machinery at the start of each term to ensure it is in a safe operating condition, in accordance with relevant standards and manufacturers instruction.
- All student motorcycles must be stored in the locked motorcycle shed when not in use.
- Fuel must only be stored in the locked motorcycle shed or locked cabinet.



3. Course Safety and Management

- Safety barriers shall, wherever practical be erected around any immovable obstruction/obstacles to reduce the risk of impact related injury.
- The course shall be kept free of obstruction, hazardous material and rubbish
- Only authorised students who have received parental permission will be permitted access to the motorcycle course.
- Person/s affected by medications or substances will not be permitted to ride motorcycles on the College site.
- All students must carry a mobile phone in case of emergencies.

4. Other

- Competition based racing or time trials are not sanctioned by these guidelines
- Weekends are at the discretion of the Motorcycle Co-ordinator, but students must be back at the college by 5.30pm always.
- Bikes not to leave shed before 10am on weekends.

Students must have completed an induction riding course through the college to demonstrate their skill level. Students will not be allowed to participate in the program until they can pass this course.

Induction competencies to be demonstrated will be:

- Ability to start motorcycle and identify possible reasons for the bike not starting.
- Ability to depart and stop using appropriate throttle, clutch and brake control.
- Ability to ride in a 'figure of 8' at 5-10km/h without putting a foot down.
- Ability to safely initiate and complete an emergency stop at approximately 40km/h within 10 metres.
- Ability to explain potential personal risk factors like condition of the track, weather conditions, current injuries and riding ability.

Failure to be able to demonstrate competencies will not mean exclusion from the activity. The student will be required to undertake training by the supervisor to bring their skills up to an appropriate 'competent' level before being retested and then allowed to 'free ride' on the course.
