Refunds

Important Information – Equine Program



This information should be read in conjunction with the WA College of Agriculture – Denmark [Horse Guidelines](#) and the [Uniforms and Residential Requirements 2020](#).

Equestrian Helmets - Mandatory Requirement

Students participating in the Equine program either during school or residential time are **REQUIRED** to provide their own equestrian helmet. An approved equestrian helmet is one that meets [Australian Standard AS/NZS 3838-2006](#) or equivalent, is within date and is specifically designed for equestrian use.

Uniform Requirements

All students must be appropriately dressed in long pants or jodhpurs [navy blue in colour], suitable boots and a long-sleeved shirt. High visibility vests will be supplied by the College for on farm riding.

Horse Feed / Biosecurity

No hay is to be brought onto the College Farm in order to comply with farm Biosecurity. Quality hay is provided by the College of which is inclusive of the Horse Agistment charge. All other horse feed requirements are to be purchased prior to the horse coming onto the College site. A regular worming program must be carried out as well as hoof maintenance.

Horse Agistment

Having a horse agisted at the College allows your child access to their own horse during the equine program, after school and during the residential program. Your horse will be provided with a safe shared paddock with secure facilities to store equine related equipment and feed. The College recently completed the construction of a state-of-the-art all-weather undercover arena for use by students. Privately owned horses are the sole responsibility of the owner and as such are responsible for all health, veterinary, farriery and dental treatments. The cost for agisting your horse at the College is \$250.00 per term which is inclusive of hay requirements.

Use of College Horse

The College will provide access to a College owned horse during the school program. No one horse is allocated to a student and access is at the discretion of the Equine Supervisor. Students will not have access to College owned horses after hours without the prior permission of the Equine Supervisor.

Excursions

Refunds will be made if a student leaves the College through their own choice or through termination of residency. Fees pre-paid beyond the immediate term are also refundable.

Recreation Centre Entry

Students can participate in a range of activities such as dance, acrobatics, swimming, exercise classes and more at local recreation centres. Payment for such activities will be made directly to the centre by students or their parents / carers.

Sports Affiliation Fees and Other Extra Curricular Activities

Students can participate in a choice of sports such as netball, basketball, football, golf and dancing just to name a few. Parents / carers will pay directly to the sports affiliation or organisation chosen by their child.

Individual Travel Charges

There may be occasions where individual students may need to be taken to Albany or Albany Airport at the request of parents / carers. Examples of this are where a parent requires a student to fly home during term time for family reasons, or a pre-arranged specialist medical appointment. In these cases, the College reserves the right to charge a fee to cover the trip and staff time transporting the student. The cost will be no more than \$50 for one-way travel.

Q Fever Vaccinations

Q Fever is a disease that affects humans and other animals. The organism is uncommon but may be found in cattle, sheep, goats and other domestic mammals as these animals are carriers of the disease. Humans can pick up the bacteria when they come into contact with the faeces, urine, milk and blood of these animals. Whilst vaccination is not compulsory, it is highly recommended that all new students to the College are vaccinated against Q Fever. The cost of this will be up to \$350.00. All costs are charged at the rate of provider. Any possibility of infection can be prevented by vaccination. The vaccination may not be available through your local GP. The vaccination and associated tests cannot be claimed through Medicare. Payment of Q Fever vaccination charges is required in advance.

First Aid Course

All Year 11 and new Year 12 students enrolling into College will need to complete a First Aid Certificate. The cost of this will be up to \$120.00. If a student already has a current first aid certificate, a photocopy is required to put on the student file and an exemption from the course will be given.

Recreational Skippers Ticket

The Recreational Skippers Ticket (RST) is a qualification based on a set of State marine safety competencies for which the skipper of a boat is required to be certified if in charge of a vessel with a motor of 6HP or more. Training of this course is delivered by the Great Southern Maritime Training Centre with the final practical assessment conducted by South Coast Diving Supplies. The cost associated with the instruction of this course is \$195.00 including GST. For students who do not hold a current Driver's License or Learner's Permit, there will be an extra charge of up to \$120.00 for an eyesight / medical examination. All costs are charged at the rate of the provider. The medical examination cannot be claimed through Medicare. Payment of RST charges is required in advance. Discounted medical examinations may apply when combined with the scuba diving medical. Further information will be provided prior to the course being run.

Scuba Diving Course

The course consists of theory sessions in conjunction with practical training and assessment. Participation in the course is subject to the successful completion of a compulsory medical assessment which cannot be claimed through Medicare. Discounted medical examinations may apply when combined with the recreational skippers ticket medical. Payment is required prior to participation in the course. Fees for the course are inclusive of all equipment hire. Further information will be provided prior to the course being run.

TRANSWA Bus Travel

If required, the College will make and pay for bus reservations for students on home weekends and at the end of each term. Parents / carers will be charged for the cost of these tickets. On all other occasions when students are travelling home, parents / carers will be responsible for making and paying of reservations.

Automotive / Engineering Student Projects

All Metals and Engineering students are required to make a personal project. The cost of the project for Year 10 and 11 students is covered by the subject charge. Year 12 students are required to meet the costs of their major project. Past costs of such projects have ranged from \$ 100 to \$ 4000 relative to the scale and complexity of projects. The Year 12 students, in consultation with parents / carers and teachers, will be required to identify a personal project in the first 3 weeks of Term 1, and as part of their training, will have to prepare a costing for their approved project. A 50% deposit must be made before materials are purchased and the balance paid before the completed project leaves the College site. Projects with an unpaid balance will be required to remain at the College until payment is cleared.

Important information regarding Personal Accident Insurance



The Department of Education does not provide personal accident insurance for students while they are at school. Parents and carers may obtain personal accident insurance for their child from a private insurer of their choice. The Department or schools do not broker personal accident insurance for students or any other person. Further, there is no cover for ambulance fees whether or not the school has called an ambulance. The exception to this rule is if a student is on authorised work experience or a camp or excursion involving an overnight stay.

Financial Assistance Available

Boarding Away from Home Allowance - Agricultural Special Subsidy

The Western Australian Department of Education makes available a student Boarding Away from Home Allowance (BAHA) each year to families with children attending primary and/or secondary school. In 2020, this allowance will be **\$1,634** if the student is in residential accommodation for the entire year. Pro-rata payments are also made. This subsidy is not available to:

- Parents / carers who are in receipt of Assistance for Isolated Children;
- Students who are in receipt of Youth Allowance at the Away Rate; or
- Students who are in receipt of ABSTUDY with full boarding paid by Centrelink.

Application forms will be provided to parents / carers in March with a closing date of 31 July. Deductions will be made to the student account once the College receives the completed form.

Boarding Away from Home Allowance - Assistance for Isolated Children Recipients

In 2020 this allowance will be **\$1,634** if the student is in residential accommodation for the entire year subject to confirmation that you have received the Assistance for Isolated Children (AIC) allowance or Second Home Allowance for the whole of the year. Pro rata payments are also made for periods over one month in duration. Application forms are provided to parents / carers in March with a closing date of 30 November and a deduction made to the student account once the College receives the completed form along with evidence of receiving AIC. Should your details change at any time during the year, please notify the Department of Education via email student.allowances@education.wa.edu.au.

Secondary Assistance Scheme

The Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. To be eligible for the allowance the parent / carer must hold a Centrelink Family Health Care Card, Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or a Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card that represents a statement of low income for the family. The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance which will be paid to the parent / carer unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the College.
- \$235 Education Program Allowance which is paid directly to the College and will be deducted from contributions and charges.

Application forms will be sent with the first newsletter in Term 1. These forms will need to be completed and returned to the College prior to the closing date usually the last day of Term 1. Late applications will not be accepted.

ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance

The Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is available to valid Department of Human Services (Centrelink) card holders, this funding supplements the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) ABSTUDY Fees Allowance payment. To be eligible for the supplement allowance, the parent/guardian must hold a Department of Human Services (Centrelink) or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family. Furthermore, the school or parent must have received the School Fee Allowance of \$78 or \$156 from the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) as part of the student's ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance. The Department of Education ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance consists of \$79 paid directly to the school. Please note that the Secondary Assistance Scheme cannot be claimed as well as this allowance.

Assistance for Isolated Children (AIC)

You may be eligible for Assistance for Isolated Children Scheme payments if:

- you meet residence requirements;
- your family home is geographically isolated from an appropriate state school;
- the student has a disability or a special health related or educational need that cannot be met at a local state school;
- the student does not have reasonable daily access to state schooling for at least 20 school days in a year for reasons beyond the family's control
- the student is not geographically isolated but they do not have reasonable daily access to state schooling; and
- the student:
 - boards away from home at a school or hostel or privately; or
 - can go to school daily because your family has a second home; or
 - lives at home and is undertaking distance education or approved home schooling.

Applications for Assistance for Isolated Children are made directly through your nearest Department of Human Services (Centrelink) office or by calling **13 23 18**. Further information is available at www.humanservices.gov.au.

Student Subsidised Travel Scheme

The Student Subsidised Travel Scheme provides travel assistance to school and tertiary students between home and school by regular passenger transport (air, bus or rail) via the most direct route. Personal Payment Plan

A personalised instalment plan is an available option to help you pay College subject and residential boarding fees in regular affordable instalments.
